**Victor Aguirregabiria** is a Professor of Economics at the University of Toronto. His research interests include industrial organization, labor markets, and the dynamics of retail firm behavior.



**Melissa Dell** is an Assistant Professor of Economics at Harvard University. Her research interests include long-run economic development primarily in Latin America and Asia.



**Raquel Fernández** is a Professor of Economics at New York University. Her research interests include the intergenerational transmission of inequality, education policy, and the economics of culture.



**Ryan Kellogg** is a Professor at the University of Chicago. His research interests are primarily in energy economics and include the economic consequences of the shale gas boom.



**Ralph Ossa** is a Professor of Economics at the University of Zurich. His research interests include the study of globalization, emerging markets and trade wars.



**Nina Pavenik** is a Professor of Economics at Dartmouth College. Her research studies the effect of large-scale trade policy reforms on inequality and child labor.

**Catherine Wolfram** is the Cora Jane Flood Professor of Business Administration at the Haas School of Business, Berkeley. Her research interests include environmental and energy economics. She has studied the impact of environmental regulation on energy markets, as well as the effects of electricity industry privatization.
